Medical Gas Braze Test FAQs

Unsuccessful Original Medical Gas Braze Test

Q: I submitted an original medical gas braze test (BTS15) and failed one joint of the horizontal position, do I need to submit both positions and both joints when retesting for an unacceptable braze result?

A: Yes, you will be submitting a full set of test coupons as you did for the original braze test. This means both joints for both positions with a new BQR showing the new test date. NITC is no longer allowed to provide partial credit for braze tests.

Q: I tested for my original medical gas braze (BTS15) at a training facility where I had taken the ASSE 6010 Course, but was notified that I had failed the braze test. Do I need to go back to the training facility to test?

A: Yes and No. **No**, you are not required to go back to or contact the training facility if you are employed by a Contractor who owns a qualified brazing procedure specification (BPS), similar or exact to the one specified on your BQR15, and the Contractor has designated a Company Representative meeting the requirements of ASME BPV Code, Section IX, Part QG-106 to supervise your test session, and the Contractor's facility is equipped to accommodate the supervision of a test session.

Yes, if you are NOT employed by a Contractor, you would not need to make other arrangements by contacting the training facility where you had tested for information on retesting.

PLEASE NOTE: For reference, NITC has placed a copy of the supporting BPS specified on all NITC medical gas braze BQRs <u>here on the NITC website</u>. However, this copy of the NITC BPS is for <u>support of brazer performance qualifications only</u>. The BPS is invalid for production brazing unless it includes the other twenty-seven pages referenced under the "Supporting Procedure Qualification Records" section of the document.

Requalification of a Lapsed Medical Gas Braze Continuity

Q: I was not working due to an illness and my braze continuity has expired, is there any way to requalify my NITC braze credentials?

A: Yes, there is. If you have lapsed in continuity (Not brazed with the qualified procedure for a period exceeding six-months) and are now employed. You may requalify your NITC medical gas braze credentials anytime by simply submitting one vertical upflow joint following the original <u>BTS15</u> medial gas braze test packet. We suggest performing both vertical upflow joints with two pieces of tube and one coupling, as most test stands will not accommodate one piece of tube with a coupling. By successfully submitting one 1 ½" vertical upflow joint; all previously obtained NITC medical gas braze credentials will be extended by six-months. E.g. BTS34, BTS4, etc. PLEASE NOTE: You must submit a new BQR15 with the requalification coupon, which means you need to have the Company's Designated Representative supervise the test session and complete the BQR.
